The fifth annual "**Summer Chiller**" Figure Skating competition will be held at the Fort Myers Skatium, 2250 Broadway Fort Myers, FL 33901, beginning Friday, June 22, 2012 and ending Saturday, June 24, 2012. No admission fee will be charged.

**RULES**— Sanctioned by United States Figure Skating and conducted in association with United States Figure Skating rules governing non-qualifying competitions as set forth in the 2012 edition of the Rulebook for the 2011-2012 competitive season *and any changes deemed "immediate" at the 2012 Governing Council meeting.* City of Palms Figure Skating Club, U.S. Figure Skating and Fort Myers Skatium accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition; competitors assume the risk of competing in accordance with U.S. Figure Skating rule CR 2300. The selection of all officials will comply with the rules for competitions as set out in the U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook and in the criteria developed for U.S. Figure Skating competition. Juvenile through Senior Free Skate, Intermediate through Senior Short Program, Novice through Senior Pairs Short Program and Juvenile through Senior Pairs Free Skating, will be judged using the IJS. All other events will be judged using the 6.0 judging format. *Juvenile through senior skaters entered in freeskate and short program events must submit the USFS online program content form by June 10, 2012. This form can be found on EntryEeze.*

**DEADLINE:** Entries are due **no later than midnight, May 22, 2012.** Late entries may be accepted only with the approval of the Competition Chairperson and Chief Referee; a late fee of \$30 will be applied.

**ELIGIBILITY (USFSA Events)** - The competition is open to all eligible skaters who are members of US Figure Skating in accordance with section 3050 and 3060. Skaters' eligibility will be determined by the highest free skate passed as of the competition deadline. Skaters may not compete below their test level, but may compete at one level higher. The competition committee reserves the right to limit the size of each group or to combine or divide groups. The committee may eliminate events due to insufficient entries. Pre-Juvenile skaters and below will be grouped by birth date. Skaters may compete at their test level or one level higher BUT NOT BOTH in the same event, in all cases except dance events.

**ELIGIBILITY (Basic Skills Events)** The Summer Chiller is open to all skaters who are eligible (ER1.00) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/club or any other Basic Skills Program/club. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of the closing date of entries, May 22nd. All Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills 1-8 skaters must skate at their highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

It is very important to the success of the competition that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If for whatever reason, the LOC discovers that a skater has been placed in a category below their class level, the chairman and referee will have the option to move the skater into the proper division even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors. Please be sure to check for the director/instructor's signature confirming the level of the skater.

If there is only one competitor entered in a Basic Skills event, the referee will give the skater the option to compete. If the competitor chooses to compete, they will be awarded their marks in the 6.0 system, and the competitor will receive first place. If they choose not to compete, the entry fee will be refunded.

**EVENTS** – Pre-Juvenile events and below will be grouped according to age. Juvenile and above will be grouped as set forth in the current Rulebook. All age-restricted events will be determined by the skater’s age as of the competition deadline. If there are fewer than two skaters in an event, skaters may be judged against the standard for that level. **A BASIC SKILLS COMPETITION WILL BE HELD ON IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE SUMMER CHILLER FOR BEGINNING SKATERS!**

**AWARDS** - Medals will be awarded first through fourth place in all events.

**ENTRIES AND FEES** - Entries must be submitted on-line through Entryeze by May 22, 2012. Visit [www.cityofpalmsfsc.com](http://www.cityofpalmsfsc.com) for registration link and additional competition information. Entry Fees must be paid online via Entryeze. The entry fee is \$120.00 for the first IJS USFS event and \$70.00 for each additional IJS event (Singles and Pairs Free Skate and Short Programs Juvenile thru Senior Levels). \$90.00 for the first Non IJS event entered and \$45.00 for each additional Non IJS event. . All entries submitted after May 22, 2012 will be considered late entries. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee, and will be charged a one time late fee of \$35.00 per application. There will be a \$30.00 service fee assessed if the skater enters the wrong event and has to be changed. If these fees apply they must be paid before the skater competes. No refunds will be given for any reason after the closing date.

**PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM**

If you are registering for an IJS event, you are required to complete the Planned Program Element form by June 10, 2012. This form can be found online at EntryEeze.

**CRITIQUES** - Will be offered for all IJS events on a time-available basis. Please sign up for critiques at the Registration Desk prior to your event.

**REGISTRATION** - The official registration desk will be located in the lobby and will be open from one hour prior to the start of the competition until the close of competition each day. **COMPETITORS MUST CHECK IN AT THE REGISTRATION DESK AT LEAST ONE HOUR BEFORE THEIR EVENT.**

**OFFICIAL NOTICES** - An official bulletin board will be maintained in the lobby. Posting of schedules and announcements thereon shall constitute sufficient official notice for competitors, coaches, and officials. Check the official bulletin board immediately upon arrival for any changes in event time.

**MUSIC** - Will be reproduced through the arena sound systems on COMPACT DISCS (CD-R) furnished by the competitor. CDs must be clearly marked with the competitor’s name and event entered on the side to be played. All competitors must have additional copies of their music available as back up during their event. Only one piece of music per CD. Music must be turned in at check-in and will not be returned until after the event has been skated.

**OFFICIAL ARENA** - All practice ice and competition events will take place at Fort Myers Skatium, 2250 Broadway, Fort Myers, FL 33901. The ice surface measures 200’ x 85’. The facility has dressing rooms, free parking and a concession area.

**OFFICIAL SCHEDULE** - The official schedule will be posted on the club web site: [www.cityofpalmsfsc.com](http://www.cityofpalmsfsc.com) and [www.floridaskating.com](http://www.floridaskating.com), skater’s individual schedules will be available on EntryEeze.com.

**PRACTICE ICE** - Practice ice will be available starting on Friday, June 22, 2012. All practice ice sessions will run twenty minutes at a charge of \$12.00 per session/person. Practice ice will be sold on a first come, first served basis.

Advance reservations can be made when registering for the competition. Payment must be made in advance to guarantee space. Walk on space as available.

### **VIDEO**

Individual videotaping will be permitted in designated areas ONLY. Professional video taping of each event will be available. Except for the official video producer, only battery-operated cameras will be permitted with **NO tripods**. NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY, PLEASE!

**TEST SESSION** – There will be a test session offered on Friday, June 22. All levels and all disciplines are planned.

## **Competition Events - Free Skating**

For each event, competitors may enter only one level. Event eligibility is based on age and test status as of May 25, 2012. Skaters may skate one level higher than their current test level. Free Skate and Short Program will be skated as separate events for Juvenile level and above. Programs should follow rules and limitations for a balanced program for the 2011-2012 Competitive Season as stated in US Figure Skating Official Rule Book. Short and Free Skate programs will be skated on full ice with music (no vocals). **Programs are +/- 10 seconds.** Additional restrictions are stated below. Skaters may skate either regular free skate event or test track event but not both in the same competition.

### Free Skating Test Track

Skaters may enter **EITHER** the Competitive Test Track or the —Well Balanced Free Skate|| but **NOT** both. Competitors will skate to the music of their choice. Deductions **WILL** be made for the skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description. All times are +/-10 seconds.

### **Compulsory Events**

Test requirements are the same as those listed under Freestyle. Skaters may skate one level higher than their current test level. Events may be combined. Field moves and connecting steps between elements are allowed. Juvenile and above skated on full ice, all other events will be skated on half ice and may be skated in any order. During spirals free leg must be held in position for 3 seconds to be counted. No Music. Axels are considered single jumps unless otherwise noted.

## Jumps

Qualifications for Jumps are the same as stated in the Free Skate Section. **Pre-Preliminary through juvenile, open juvenile and all adult levels will skate on half ice.** Jumps may be performed in any order. Combination jumps must be performed with no turn or change of foot between jumps. The jump combination may consist of the same jump or another jump (single, double, and triple as prescribed). However, the jumps included must be different from the solo jumps unless otherwise stated. Skaters will be given only **one** opportunity to perform each jump.

Spins will be skated without music and without stopping between spins. Connecting steps allowed but only those transitions affecting entrance and exit of spins will be judged. All events will be skated on half ice. Spins may be skated in any order and only once. Max. time is 1:30.

### Showcase

Showcase events are to be skated to music. Vocal music allowed. Emphasis is placed on the theatrical and entertainment value of the performance rather than technical accuracy. Props that do not alter the ice surface in any way are allowed. Skaters have a maximum of 30 seconds to place and remove all props (no props during warm-up). Skaters should be able to manage their props without assistance. This event may be combined.
